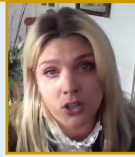

JANUARY 5 PROGRAM

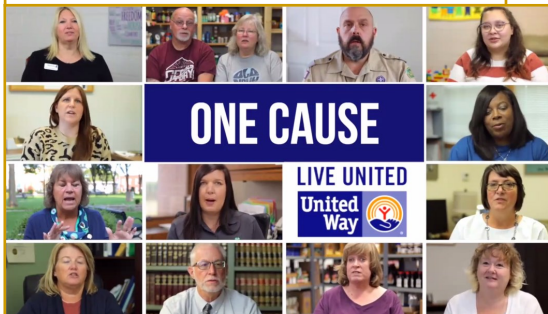
