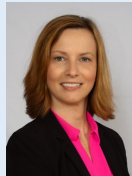

July 13 Program - OSF St. Clare President Jackie Kernan



Kyle Burrows introduced OSF St. Clare and St. Luke's Medical Center President Jackie Kernan. Kernan spoke to our Club about the organization that officially took control of Perry Memorial Hospital on July 1, 2021.

Kernan, who has been part of the Perry transition since February, began by explaining the mission of OSF Healthcare and sharing some history of the Sisters of the Third Order of St. Francis and their healthcare ministry. The Order's first hospital was started in Peoria, IL in 1877. All employees of the organization are known as "Mission Partners" and the Sisters believe that their mission is achieved by the participation of the entire organization toward the goal of community health.

She then highlighted some of the benefits of OSF St. Clare joining a larger hospital network. As a member of the groups western region, our local hospital now has a vast network of
