July 20 Program - Joe Park of In Home Care Connection



Tracy Grimmer introduced Joe Park of In Home Care Connection. Along with his PowerPoint, Joe shared a brochure and other information detailing the services they provide. Their team is made up of nurses, therapists, social workers, aides, caregivers, and case managers. They have grown from 2 employees at the start to 195 employees as of their last payroll! Their hospice services are provided in 13 counties in Illinois and 7 counties in Iowa. They also provide private duty nursing in 16 Illinois counties. Hospice services cover 9 counties in Illinois. Joe said they were recently accredited in June. In total, they serve 784 patients! Joe focused much of his conversation around the hospice care provided, along with facts and myths. He stated that for them, hospice is not a separate place — it is where a person feels home which could include assisted living, a long-term care facility or their own home. Joe noted
