**August 3 Program — U.S. Representative Adam Kinzinger**

Joe Kitchens introduced U.S. Representative Adam Kinzinger who provided us with a brief update on current events in Washington D.C. Rep. Kinzinger talked about commonality and the fact "we're all Americans" and shared examples of coming together to create a Covid vaccine. He touched on the United States' commitment to serve in Afghanistan and the pulling out of troops. Kinzinger then commented on the uneasiness in the Middle East and supply chain vulnerability with China, as well as increasing energy/fuel costs. He noted that Rotary focuses on coming together even though there is division within the country, and he referenced our "4 way test." According to Kinzinger, we need to get away from society stoking cultural differences and look at earlier times when all religions and differences in people formed the United States. Kinzinger then wanted to address the "elephant in the room" which is the January 6 committee. He said he never wanted to be on the committee and had hoped that 5 people from each party would be selected, but he was asked to serve and wanted to do the right thing. Representative Kinzinger took a couple of questions from Rotarians before departing.
