September 14 Program - Jacob Love Illinois National Guard

Joe Kitchens introduced Jacob Love who spoke about the Illinois Army National Guard, his experience, and recruiting efforts. Jake joined the Guard 12 years ago and has been a recruiter since April 2019. He is a previous Princeton Rotarian! Jake noted that the Guard is the oldest branch of the military, being established in 1636, and it's the only branch of the military that is required by the U.S. Constitution. There are currently over 450,000 part-time soldiers, with Illinois averaging around 10,000. Jake spoke of the assistance the Guard provides in terms of COVID relief, natural disasters, and civil unrest. There are currently over 100 "jobs" combining enlisted, officer, and warrant officer fields, and Jake provided a handout with these various specialties. He also shared a brochure that details the flexibility and benefits of the Guard. Jake said it's a great way to earn extra money and have a college education paid for!

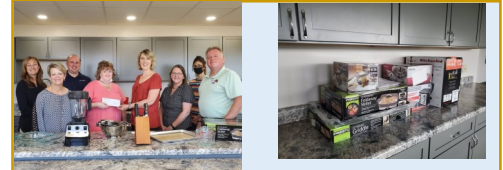

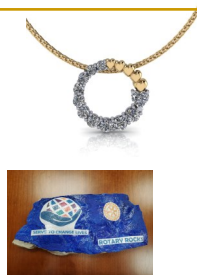
