Dana VanAutreuve
Second Story Teen Center
Joe Kitchens introduced Dana VanAutreuve who shared a lot of interesting information about the Second Story Teen Center! Dana and her husband, Jeff, opened the center 12 years ago with a passion to reach teens and provide a safe place. The momentum continues, and they are averaging 40 - 60 teens on Tuesday evenings and 70 - 90 on Fridays with a total of 500 teens in their log-in system!. They serve 6th grade through high school and are a 501(c)3 organization. The entire staff is volunteer, and they are always looking for adults to share their talents. In addition to home-cooked meals (or pizza!) each night, the teens can experience sewing, mechanics, guitar lessons, art projects, and tutoring. Services have grown to include a pantry with non-perishable foods and personal care items, and teens have unlimited access. Dana shared a "wish list" of popular items and talked about their
