Joe Kitchens introduced Don Kirby, an Army veteran, and Brad Oeder, an Air Force veteran, who shared information about the Princeton Veterans Organization. This group is local to Princeton and includes every branch of service and veterans with an honorable discharge. They were formed over 10 years ago with no charter or legal standing but to serve a common purpose of making life better for the community and, specifically, veterans. The organization consists of American Legion Post #125, Amvets Post #180, and VFW Post #4323. They are also supported by the American Legion Ladies Auxiliary throughout the year. They shared a flyer with a number of events they are involved in each year. Some of these that they touched on include a drop-off site for American flags for ceremonial burns, repair for the Flags of Freedom flags, visiting veterans in nursing homes to present flags and wreaths, loaning medical equipment, participating in parades, and providing an Honor Guard for military funerals, just to name a few! They are also working with Arukah Institute and the C5 Rural Network to bring access and awareness to veteran's services in Bureau County. Their presentation was concluded by reciting the "Oath of Service" that all branches of services administer at the time of enlistment. Thank you, gentlemen, for your service and informative program!
