Victoria Yepsen -
Bureau County
United Way

Joe Kitchens introduced Victoria Yepsen, Executive Director of the

Bureau County United Way. She shared their mission statement and talked about a number of ways they have supported the 13 different non-profit agencies they are funding this year. Those agencies include Girl Scouts of Central IL, University of Illinois Extension (4-H), W.D. Boyce Council of Boy Scouts, Youth Service Bureau, Braveheart Children's Advocacy, Second Story Teen Center, Bureau County American Red Cross, Bureau County Food Pantry, The Center for Youth and Family Solutions, Prairie State Legal Services, Freedom House, Gateway Services, and Bureau County Senior Citizens Association. All money provided to these agencies helps to provide services and supports in a variety of ways unique to each organization. Victoria indicated that the United Way creates connections between agencies as well. She spoke briefly about the upcoming beer and
