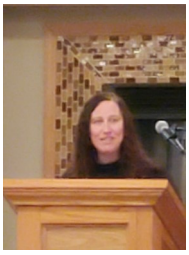

February 22 Program
Jaime Deiters —
BroadPath

Joe Kitchens introduced fellow Rotarian Jaime Deiters who provided an informative program on BroadPath and their services. BroadPath is essentially a work from home business established in 2008. 97% of their employees work from home, and that number increased to 99% since the pandemic. Their headquarters are in Tucson, AZ and they focused on Princeton for an office due to the appeal of Main Street and the fact that there are not many remote/work from home sites here. The CEO's wife is also originally from the area. The office here opened in 2021 and by the end of this year, they hope to have 3 more locations. There are 43 active employees here. Wages begin at \$14/hour but increase to \$14.50 after a 4 week training and a 2 week "nesting" period. Jaime described "nesting" as production being monitored by a subject matter expert before an employee is independent on the job. BroadPath focuses on the financial industry, health care, and travel and hospitality by providing customer service solutions, and they have over 100 clients. They are finding their best results within a 40
