April 12 Program Sharon Schallhorn

Cathy Foes introduced Sharon Schallhorn, Bureau County Administrator, for our program. Cathy shared a bit

of educational and professional background before Sharon addressed Rotarians. She talked about her past experiences and civilian job within the military setting and noted that she is now a resident of LaMoille. Sharon compared the Bureau County Government to that of an orchestra, noting that everyone has their part to play. In many ways, she is like the conductor - ensuring that all departments and personnel are working together. She has been in this position for 5 years. Sharon talked about a few things going on in the County now. They are working to expand technology and are excited that e-pay is now an option for the Animal Control department where residents of the County can pay for rabies tags for pets online. It is hoped that online payments may be available for other services in the future. The County is also sponsoring an e-recycling event coming up in Cherry on April 30th from 9 a.m. - noon. At that time, Sheriff Reed answered a couple of questions about the new County jail and timelines for opening which were delayed due to supply chain issues and minor design "fixes."
