April 19 Program Sharon Meisenheimer

Joanne Sheldon introduced Sharon Meisenheimer, a retired missionary nurse, who presented an interesting program about her 37 years of missionary

service in Ecuador. Sharon was born and raised on a farm in Bureau County and met her husband, Lester, in high school. She noted that she has always believed in God and read the Bible, but something was "missing." While dating, she and Lester went to a revival meeting, and she came away changed forever. Then, after being married less than 2 years, Sharon and Lester and their 9 month old son, Timmy, moved to Northwest Ecuador. Much of the area followed witch doctors and herbal healers so they introduced modern medicine. It took some time for the locals to trust, but in the first month, they had 1,000 patients! Sharon said malaria, childhood and tropical diseases were common in the region. After introducing vaccines, she explained that the whooping cough outbreak "jumped" over the area that had been vaccinated so it was deemed a success! Snake bites were common, and they found that an electric shock from a lawn mower provided help in

healing.people Sharon also sutured patients due to the number of machete cuts there were. She became known as "the lady who sews people." Sharon provided prenatal checks and personally delivered 25 babies! Sadly, she and her husband lost two daughters to Batten Disease while living in the jungle — one and birth and the other years later. Sharon concluded her story by noting that the area is a much healthier population now due to the introduction of Western medicine. She wrote a book titled, "Brought This Far" about how God's faithfulness was the constant that brought them through the difficulties and uncertainties. In the book, she shares many more stories about their time in Ecuador. Thanks to Sharon for presenting such an interesting program!
