astronauts and satellites as well as letters and news. This was during the 1960s and the Gemini project, and Scott was hooked. Now in retirement, Scott again became interested in the space program so applied to NASA to the Ambassador program and was promptly rejected! He applied again, was accepted, and had to go through intense training before being able to do presentations. Currently at NASA, we are seeing the first images from the Webb Telescope which took 25 years to build at a cost of \$10 Billion. This project was a joint effort with the United States, Canada and Europe. The telescope was only expected to cost \$500 Million and be done by 2006. The telescope was packaged and assembled in California and then shipped to Peru French Dion in South Africa for the launch on 12/25/21. This is on the equator so that gave the launch an extra push. The Webb Telescope is 13.2 billion light years away, while the universe is 13.8 billion light years. The Webb Telescope will reach as far as 13.5 billion light years away. The Hubble Telescope is still doing well, but the Webb Telescope has mirrors that are 3X larger than the Hubble which makes it 100X more powerful. The Webb Telescope is made up of the primary mirror and has scientific instruments as well. There is a large sunshade on the telescope and that is what makes it work. The mirrors must be kept VERY cold (-394 degree

Fahrenheit) and the sunshade is what keeps the mirrors cold. The Hubble Telescope is in the low Earth orbit which means if the telescope breaks, we can go out and fix it. The Webb Telescope will never be seen again because it is at range point L2. This is the "sweet spot" for the telescope to work and is in an elliptical orbit on the opposite side of Earth about 1 million miles out. When the Webb Telescope was launched, it took 30 days to totally unfold. It then took 180 days to commission which checks the scientific instruments to be sure they are working properly. The Webb telescope has four science instruments that Mr. Pelican explained in detail. This amazing telescope is expected to last 25 years. Thanks to Joe for bringing us this interesting program (and thanks to Mandi for providing the program summary!)
