Cathy Foes shared that the district-wide service project theme is "Nothing Reads Like A Book." More information will be detailed in September when we kick off Literacy Month, but Princeton Public Library will be the recipient of our efforts. Cathy then introduced Julie (Director) and Ron (Head of Youth Services). Julie talked about the various services they offer, noting one of the most popular during the pandemic was the "hotspot" lending. They have 20 devices available that can be checked out for 2 weeks. The Niche Academy is a web-based tutorial covering a variety of topics. The library is excited to have a number of upcoming programs - board and card playing night, page turners book club, a tractor show, music jam, and a lecture, "Little Fashionista on the Prairie," and much more! Julie encouraged everyone who lives in Princeton to get a library card and added that others may still be able to access services based on their consortium. A total of 92 readers read 1,379 hours with 4 kids earning a medal for 50 hours and 1 reading for 137 hours! They have also had outdoor story time, nature center activities, a magic and comedy show, and a raptor rescue and education! There is discussion about some programs for older youth, and Ron shared about an upcoming "escape room" and explained what it was to those who were not familiar. They have a lot of great things going on!
