Royal Family Kids Camp

Bob Henkelman introduced Christopher and Allyssa Burk, leaders of the Royal Family Kids Camp. This is a life changing camp for foster kids that will be coming to Bureau County in 2023! Kids between the ages of 6 and 12 who are or have been in foster care (or should have been) have an opportunity to enjoy a week with counselors and other kids involved in various activities and making memories. Currently there are 42 kids in foster care in Bureau County. There are 20,696 in the Illinois foster care system. In 2021, a total of 8,876 kids attended camp throughout the entire program. 493 of those kids returned to volunteer in some capacity. The mission of Royal Family Kids Camp is to create life changing moments for children of abuse. Their vision is that every foster child in the Bureau County area can experience a life changing camp and mentoring program. Their values are to treat people royally, keep moving forward, and make moments matter! The ratio is 1 counselor to every 2 camp-goers in order to keep everyone safe and give them the attention they deserve. During the week, they have "Everybody's

Birthday Party" complete with cake, games and presents! Kids also enjoy a polar bear swim, rock climbing, a hay rack ride, swimming, fishing, canoes/paddle boats, and crafts. Each child goes home with good memories, a Bible, camp t-shirt, quilt and pillow, photo album, clothes, and a player with camp songs. There is no cost to the kids to attend, but the average is \$750 per child — \$30,000 per year to hold the camp. The camp for Bureau County is planned for 20 kids to attend August 7 - 11, 2023, and they hope to launch a mentor program in September 2023; this will be ongoing contact with the kids outside of the camp week.
