November 22 Program
 Dan Whitlock
 Central American Mission Projects

Andrew Whitlock introduced his father, Dan, who has served as President of C.A.M.P. since 2005. Dan is in his 29th year of missionary work! Central American Mission Projects is a 501(c)3 organization that has grown since its beginning in 1975. Work originally began with construction only but now serves health and social needs. Dan noted that years ago, Rotary provided some funds to help start a library in Costa Rica, and kids and adults regularly use the facility. Many of C.A.M.P.'s ideals align with Rotary, in that they promote clean water and sanitary conditions, education, and health. Dan provided a brochure that detailed each of their focuses - construction projects, shoes ministry, education and backpacks, and medical and dental partnerships. Dan shared a PowerPoint with numerous photos as he talked about mission trips he and his wife have participated in. He told about

feeding centers that are being built to offer food and give nutrition education and Casa Luz, a home for young mothers that provides for socialization, parenting skills, and a message of empowering women. Many new moms are 11 - 17 years old and are victims of abuse and exploitation. C.A.M.P. is the only international team to be recognized by Habitat for Humanity. They have built houses from start to finish in 3 weeks. Other builds have included medical clinics, churches, youth camps, social centers, the library, and an orphanage for little girls. January, February, and March 2023 mission trips are already organized. Dan said they receive a lot of support from SIU-E with donated equipment and student nurses and other faculty.
