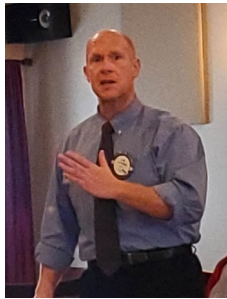

**December 6 Program**  
 Bureau County 4-H  
 J.D. Orwig

J.D., shared his experiences with 4-H, first as a child and now as an adult with kids who have gotten involved. J.D. talked about growing up on a farm and participating in 4-H and the "Sale of Champions." He showed hogs and was able to meet others his age. Now that he is a father with 3 kids, showing pigs has become a "hobby." J.D. was quick to note that the game has changed. When he was growing up, most 4-H'ers were kids who lived on farms. Today, most kids don't live on farms, and they buy their show pigs. J.D. said there are a variety of pig breeders that focus on special genetics, and it's even possible to shop online (check out [thepigplanet.com](http://thepigplanet.com)!) J.D. noted that feed has even changed. It used to be just corn and soybean meal, but today there are additives - some that even smell like cookies. Finally, J.D. said the projects kids get involved in have changed. Kids are spending more money than ever now. This brought J.D. to the topic of "Sale of Champions." Individuals and businesses can provide sponsorships through the Bureau County Cattlemen's Association. They, in turn, bring some of the money back to the kids to offset their expenses. Funds are proportionately divided to those with market animals. J.D. concluded his presentation with a Q&A session where we learned that most champions stay with the 4-H'er, although some are actually sold. J.D. encouraged Rotarians to reach out for more information or to provide a sponsorship. Thanks, J.D., for helping out at the last minute with an interesting program.
