**January 10 Program**  
**Todd Volker - Habitat for Humanity**  
 Cathy Foes introduced Todd Volker, Executive Director for Habitat for Humanity of LaSalle, Bureau, and Putnam Counties. The idea for

Habitat for Humanity began with Koinonia Farm, a community farm outside of Americus, GA. From there, Clarence Jordan and Habitat's eventual founders Millard and Linda Fuller developed the concept of "partnership housing." It centered on those in need of adequate shelter working side by side with volunteers to build decent, affordable houses. The houses would be built at no profit. New homeowners' house payments would be combined with no-interest loans provided by supporters and money earned by fundraising to create "The Fund for Humanity," which would then be used to build more homes. Habitat for Humanity became a reality in 1976. Locally, Todd oversees the program and the ReStore that opened about a year ago. The store generates funds for the next build. Todd said they

are starting a critical house repairs program. Their next build will be in Peru, followed by Mendota or Princeton. The last build in Princeton was in 2009, and they do own a lot here for a future home. Todd said they are always looking for volunteers for the builds or to work in the store. In the Q&A portion of the presentation, he shared that there is a family selection committee that decides who gets the house; it is similar to that of a mortgage process. They also complete an inspection of the prospective home owner's residence before making a decision. Home owners are expected to help with the project and put in 500 volunteer hours.
