January 31 Program
Denise Ihrig, Bureau County Senior Center

Lynn Olds introduced Denise Ihrig, Director of the Bureau County Senior Center. Denise has been with BCSC for 16 years. She shared information about the "Dementia Friendly" project and noted that Rotarians Tom Kammerer, Jenica Cole, and Lynn Olds serve on a committee. An action team of about 20 people meet once monthly and have helped to identify some beneficial initiatives for area seniors. Denise said there are now 5 at the Illinois level awaiting approval. A Princeton Caregiver Support Group will be offered on the second Thursday of each month from 1 - 2:30 p.m. at the local library. VITAS Hospice and Kate Webster at Greenfield have been helpful in getting this started. Next, Denise talked about the "Care Trak" system, with additional input from Chief Kammerer. There are 25 communities in Illinois that are dementia-friendly, and hopefully Princeton will join the list soon. The Princeton Police Department has purchased 2 tracking devices and will

train officers. Each wearable device is about \$300, and they will do some fundraising to help those who cannot afford one. These would be available to seniors with dementia and people with disabilities and/or autism - all who are at a higher risk of becoming lost. Denise also talked about "Dementia Friends." This is a 1 hour training that she encouraged all area businesses to participate in. A decal on the door/window will acknowledge those businesses. Denise hopes to have bags with information including dementia/Alzheimer's resources for area hospitals and clinics, home health, and the Chamber. She concluded with a Q&A session. 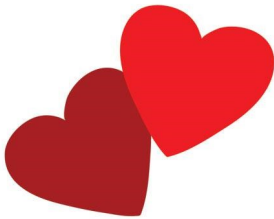
