February 28 Program Hungry World Farm
Lynn Olds introduced Cal & Carol Zehr and Karla Stoltzfus-Detweiler of Hungry World Farm. Cal, who is a pastor and board president of the farm, said they are a ministry dedicated to the theory of food production and consumption in consideration of hunger. Their programs provide experience here and around the world. Karla is their executive director and went on to share their vision and mission. One of their program areas is land care which includes livestock, a market garden, and agroforestry (growing trees with nuts/berries). Another area, food sharing, allows them to donate 10% of their produce to food pantries and others. SNAP benefits can be used at the farm, and they regularly sell food on the farm and at farmers markets. They are working on a farm to table wood-fire pizza as well. The final program area, hospitality and learning, includes learning events, tours, an internship program, retreats, and lodging. Karla shared details of a learning tour and a "treasure hunt" that a group participated in last summer where the

In 2022, they harvested 18,000 pounds of produce from their garden; 4,800 pounds were donated; and they held 14 learning and fellowship events. Hungry World Farm can always use volunteers and financial support and resources. They have a community "work and play day" scheduled for April 1. Additionally, they are starting their first book study in March both virtually and in person.
