Chantha Chhim introduced Erin Rosenthal, organizer and founder of "The Store" in Sheffield. The Store is a

completely free clothing shop that came about through Erin's ideas and some help from family and friends. Erin feels blessed to be able to help others and works in a job (as an R.N.) where she sees people in ill-fitting clothes, clothing that is not seasonal, and some in complete disrepair. She has friends that operate Cornerstone Community Wellness who gave her some space, and she reached out to others for donations of used clothing. In May 2022, The Store opened for the first time as a pop-up, as Erin wanted to be sure there was a real need. About 50 people visited the first week. Then, in August, there were around 110, and finally in November, there were more than 220. The Store then established regular hours of the second Friday and second Sunday of each month. They have connected with area schools during a school supply drive or offering coats for kids and hope to do more of this. Erin has two volunteers who help her sort and open the store. The Store is planning to have "donation days" when they will accept donations. They regularly share information on their Facebook page, and Erin encouraged people to follow them.
