 Second Story  
 Teen Center**

Jenica Cole introduced Don Schiff and Janice Wamhoff to talk on behalf of the teen

center. Janice shared that they opened 13 years ago and currently operate 2 nights per week for kids in grades 6 - 12. Generally, 40 - 50 kids attend on a Tuesday during the school year, while there are around 100 on a Friday night. Their record has been 131. She talked about the variety of classes and activities and described the layout of the building for those who have never visited. Their check in/out system ensures that a responsible adult is aware that their child has arrived safely and/or left the premises. Janice said their most recent "class" has focused on manner and basic conversation skills, and it has been a huge success! In addition to everything offered upstairs, there is also a pantry that kids and families can access in the separate warehouse building. Don talked about his reason for getting involved as a volunteer, in that he was a 14 year old runaway with absent parents. The teen center has been much-needed for so many kids, thus its popularity. 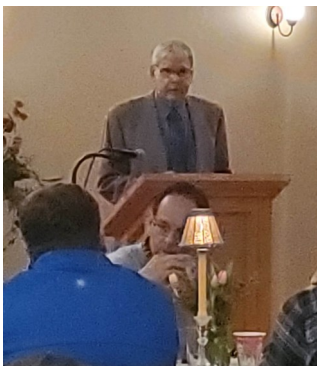
