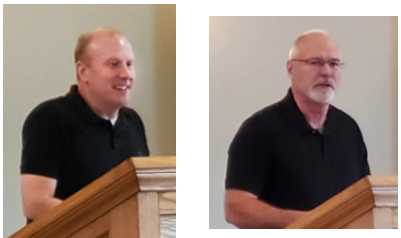

August 15 Program
Princeton Ministerial Association
 Bob Henkelman introduced Pastors Ryan Sutton (First United Methodist Church) and Doug Kirkpatrick (Princeton Wesleyan Church) of the Princeton Ministerial Association (PMA). Each shared information about themselves and how they came to serve in their current churches. There are currently 20 churches with a Princeton ZIP code, and half of these are active in the PMA. All churches are welcome. They meet monthly over lunch and share church and community news. The group has seen the need to help others but was unsure of the various resources. As a 501(c)3, they have a governing board of directors and they accept donations, and they give back 100% of funds that come in. They recently have gotten involved with fundraising. The pastors summarized their purpose as having a heart for those with struggles, either

spiritual or need-based (i.e. food, financial assistance). The PMA has a "partnership" with the local Tri-County Opportunities Council, and anyone requesting funds from the PMA must be referred to them by Tri-County. In many cases, Tri-County is able to provide assistance or link individuals or families to other resources without needing the PMA. In a 6 year period, the PMA helped 354 total households. They provided a total of \$125,390 in support throughout the area. The PMA took in \$115,000 in funds/donations. Annually, they average 59 households served and \$21,000 in total giving! Of course, some churches have their own programs and offer assistance outside of the PMA as well. The PMA has been instrumental in programs such as Christmas for Kids, 9/11 remembrance services, and a chaplain program with the police department and first responders. They also donated to Rotary's egg hunt for the community.
