September 12 Program Molly Blogg, Hornbaker Gardens
Joanne Sheldon introduced Molly Blogg, CEO of Hornbaker Gardens. Molly noted that her dad, Rich, is still involved in the business but is transitioning into retirement. Her brother, Dave, is the "artistic eye" and is responsible for the landscaping of the gardens. Business began in the 80s as Horn's Berry Farms, a u-pick strawberry patch. From there, they transitioned to a wholesale only mum business. They opened in 1990 as a retail garden center. It was during this time that their main garden display, the Hosta Ravine, was constructed. They offer over 400 varieties of hostas alone! Since then, they have added a 150 foot stream and pond with "sunny" plants. Hornbaker's is open from April 10th until October 10th. Molly shared photos of various mums and talked about plants for the cooler fall weather. This includes celosia, some ornamental peppers, and asters, all of which look great in a garden or containers. She added that hearty mums will survive the winter if they are well-

established. Hostas can also be grown in a container, but they do need dormancy time. Molly suggested they be kept in an unheated shed or garage until the spring weather arrives. Hostas love the shade but will tolerate sun with plenty of moisture. They have been experimenting with hostas and found they do well in a stream or creek. In the winter, the creek bed is dry. A new trend is including natural gardens or meadows, and Hornbaker's now has one at their main entrance. Molly talked briefly about the children's garden designed in her mom's memory and The Barn, their event center. Recently, they added an extended patio to the north side to increase outdoor seating. Their business is now fully operational on solar power as of a month ago. Molly concluded her presentation with details of their upcoming Artisan Market.
