Ken Rohwedder, SERVPRO

Eric May introduced Ken Rohwedder from SERVPRO. Ken is the Marketing Manager for the business in Davenport/Bettendorf & Moline/Rock Island & Kewanee and also happens to be a Rotarian with the North Scott Rotary Club in Iowa. He said their Club is 128 members strong, and he thanked our club for all that we do for the community. Ken talked about "service above self" and the fact that giving back feels better than receiving. In his club, they also have an auction fundraiser. They are involved in a literacy program, food drives, an "Adventures Group" with disadvantaged youth, and a program to provide accessible bikes and trikes to the Handicapped Development Center in Davenport. Ken noted that all of their little projects add up to make a big impact on their community! Since becoming a Rotarian, Ken has incorporated "service" into SERVPRO. They are a for-profit business, but they like to give back. In the past year, they hosted 62
