We were pleased to have our District 6420 Governor John Hurley with us! He talked about Stephanie Urchick being the second

female president for RI and noted there are no more "theme pins" each year because they were felt to be confusing with the Rotary wheel that is well-known. This year's theme is "The Magic of Rotary," and John asked what it means to us. He said he feels like a citizen of the world. Although he hasn't traveled to aid in polio eradication or building wells, he donates and feels he has helped facilitate these activities. John talked about The Rotary action plan - increasing our impact, expanding our reach, enhancing participant engagement, and increasing our ability to adapt. He shared a handout and said that a Rotary member joins, pays dues, comes to meetings, and occasionally helps with a service project.
