November 19 Program

Wayne Peacock introduced Dr. Steve Fine, a Rotarian from Peabody, Massachusetts.

Steve joined us via Zoom and is the founder and president of the Melanoma Education Foundation. Shortly after his son, Dan, died of melanoma in 1998 at the age of 26, he founded the non-profit Melanoma Education Foundation. During his presentation, he shared numerous photos and talked about various skin cancers. Basal cell is probably the most common and is rarely fatal. Squamous cell cancer may spread internally and become fatal without treatment, and melanoma can be successfully treated if caught early. Dr. Fine shared several statistics about melanoma but focused a large part of his presentation on what we need to know and how we can conduct a self-exam once a month and reduce our risks. An immediate visit to a dermatologist is key if there is a change in a mole, blemish, freckle, birthmark or pigmented area; a new mole or freckle appears quickly or grows rapidly; or a

mole or growth has any ABCD properties or all of the EFG properties. Asymmetry refers to 1/2 looking different than the other 1/2; border is irregular or notched; color varies across the growth; or diameter is greater than 1/4". If the growth is elevated, firm to the touch, and growing larger, Dr. Fine urged Rotarians to seek treatment immediately. A self-exam can be completed with a wall mirror and hand mirror in a well lit room or with a flashlight. The key is to be thorough and seek assistance if needed to see all areas of skin. Dr. Fine recommended using sunless tanners as the only safe way to tan. Anyone who must be in the sun should use a broad spectrum sunscreen applied heavily (and reapplied as needed), wear protective clothing, and minimize exposure between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. For more helpful information, visit the foundation website at www.skincheck.org.
