December 3 Program

Lynn Olds welcomed Rotarians to Greenfield for an amazing lunch followed by an informational program about the history of the retirement home. First known as the Adeline E. Prouty Old Ladies Home, doors opened in 1911 with 4 guests. A large portion of Mrs. Prouty's estate was earmarked to establish a retirement home for ladies, thus the start of a 12 room home on 7 acres of land at 508 Park Avenue East. Several years later, Parker Berry, a PHS graduate who went on to become an architect, was asked to design a new building to replace the existing home. A portion of his plans were then added to the existing home. In 1950, a retirement home for men was opened thanks to the Clement Field estate gift, but after a number of years was closed due to fire safety code issues. In 1977, Greenfield became a reality in a newly constructed building where men and women could both reside. To this date, the Prouty Trust remains and receives tax deductible

Sheltered care varies according to a resident's needs but allows for nursing supports and assistance with daily living. There are common areas where residents and family can relax and feel at home, an outside patio, and dining and activity areas.
