April 7 Program
 Bob Mullane introduced June Keeley, General Manager of the Illinois Valley Pistol Shrimp. She was joined by Charlie Trovero, a long-time supporter/sponsor of the team, who also happens to serve as a host family when the team is in town. The Pistol Shrimp are a prospect league summer collegiate baseball team. There are 20 teams from Iowa to Pennsylvania in the league, and it is not uncommon for scouts to attend the games to look at local talent. The Pistol Shrimp play at Schweickert Stadium in Peru, and they offer free general admission with theme nights throughout the season. Sponsors help to cover the cost of \$50,000 in transportation alone. The team plays 58 games in 65 days, and on "off" days, they attend community activities and events along with their mascot, South Claw Sam. The team has been in existence since 2019 when they played in Lisle, IL as the DuPage Pistol Shrimp. They eventually moved to Peru and are in their 6th season there. Most of the team names within
