March 24 Program

Shannon Merkel introduced Brian & Elizabeth Tribley with the Sauk Valley Chapter of Pink Heals. They are part of a nationwide not-for-profit started in Phoenix, AZ in 2007. A firefighter had a vision and dream to give back, especially to women with cancer, and his idea was to use emergency vehicles and pink gear. They now do visits to people with any type of cancer, and they complete a "national tour" across the country. There are about 26 chapters in the US. Sauk Valley travels around a 100 mile radius in the Northern Illinois area, and they've been doing this since 2017. Home visits are the most powerful, but they also go to events. They are unpaid volunteers, and there is no cost to honor someone. Typically they coordinate with the local fire station and then they show up with lights on and sirens going. They enter a site in single file, offer introductions, and
