June 2 Program

Dan Legner introduced Jason Sullivan, Service Extension Coordinator for The Salvation Army in the Peoria area. They work with organizations, community leaders, and the faith-based community to connect people with resources. The Salvation Army was founded in 1865 by William Booth, and their mission is "doing the most good." The motto is "soup, soap, and spirit through service to others." The Salvation Army is found in most counties, and they provide assistance with disaster relief, food, shelter, rehabilitation, family services, and ministry. Anyone can receive their help regardless of background, faith or community standing. The Salvation Army is made up of the Salvation Army Corps, Life 360 centers, service extensions, and emergency disaster services, and Jason talked a little about each one. The "Red Kettle" is well known, and Jason shared that 90% of every dollar donated stays in the county to help their neighbors. The remaining 10% covers kettle supplies and support from the Peoria area. Bureau County numbers have dwindled over

time — being as high as \$11,696.79 in 2019 to only \$479.13 in 2025. This largely has to do with not having volunteers to help out. A team needs a scheduling coordinator, kettle bell set-up team, bookkeeper to count and deposit money, and an assistance provider. Many strategies have included community events, Christmas walks, parades, kettles at local establishments with a volunteer, and counter kettles in restaurants and gas stations. Some of the types of assistance Jason has helped provide include utilities, rent/mortgage, food, medical supplies, HVAC repair, auto repair, and fuel cards. Jason spoke about the similarities between The Salvation Army and Rotary and how "service above self" aligns between the organizations. He concluded his presentation with Q&A and was asked a few questions by Rotarians.
